The availability of Before and After school places for Miranda Public Schools students at our local Miranda Council OOSH has been limited over the past 2 years and many working parents have had difficulty finding available care places.

I am also aware that many Kindergarten students zoned for our local Miranda Public School area, have had to seek placement at non – local schools, purely because parents can be assured of before and after school care at these schools.

Over the past 12mths I have been in contact with Sutherland Shire children's services about establishing an OOSH on our school grounds for our Miranda students. This process is very involved and involves ongoing

negotiation between the Department of Education and Sutherland Shire Council.

The Government is committed to meeting the demand for Before and After school care. To meet this

commitment they need better information about the types of services required to enable planning and support school providers.

This is a reminder that all students are to be wearing correct Miranda Public School uniform when attending school or when representing the school at Inter-school events.
