I hope all of our community realises how lucky we were to have Sharks at Kareela allow us to host our farewell this year, especially with such tight restrictions placed of schools for formals. Without their support, we would have only been able to have had a simple evening here at school.

# Year 6 Last Day – Handing out of Certificates

In following the ever-changing NSW Health and Department of Education advice on holding events it is very important that as a community, we focus on what we can do, and not lament on what we would have liked. We were worried that we might not be able to have anything at all for parents this year. That said, there has been an increase of COVID cases affecting schools very close to us.

We are hoping to have a very small and quick outdoor presentation from 2:45pm – 3:00pm on Thursday 16 December involving Stage 3 students and teachers. This will depend on dry weather and any changes to the current guidelines. If it is raining, the event will need to be cancelled.

In response to the current guidelines, we can only invite one (1) fully vaccinated parent/carer for each Year 6 child to present a graduation certificate. Year 6 Parents/carers will need to QR code in, show their vaccination certificates, remain distanced and leave with their children immediately after the ceremony. We cannot allow photographs to be taken on the school site. Plenty of photographs are already being provided to families. Of course, families are welcome to organise their own private celebrations after school at other locations.

The presentation will be held on the top basketball court. Please enter and leave by the Wandella Road gate. If you have other children, please let their teachers know that you will be waiting for them at the Wandella Road gate by Wednesday at the latest.

### **Before and After School Care -New Provider Announcement**

Sutherland Shire Council has announced that it is closing the Miranda Out of School Hours (MOOSH) care service at the end of this year. MOOSH will provide vacation care in its current location (and use our school hall) from 17 to 24 December. Please contact them immediately if you need this service.

The Department of Education has selected OSHClub, for the interim provision of out of school hours care services for our school. OSHClub is working closely with the Department and the Council to ensure a smooth transition effective from the start of vacation care in January 2022. OSHClub will commence operations with a new vacation care program in our school hall from 10 January 2022.

If your child was enrolled in out of hours school care/vacation care with the Council, you will need to re-enrol with OSHClub as personal details cannot be transferred between the different organisations. Please see the flyer attached to this newsletter.
