Professional Learning

Earlier this term, five of the executive leaders and myself joined the *3 Rivers 4 Learning* project with a leading educational researcher, Ann McIntyre. A number of other schools from southern Sydney have also volunteered. Our joint inquiry will focus on leading teachers to use formative assessment expertly to maximise learning for all of our students.

Two weeks ago, week I attended the Principals' Induction conference for all newly appointed principals. This week I attended the first two seminars of the *Aspiring Principals Leadership Program*. The prestigious APLP has a scholarship provided to all successful candidates.

The 3 Rivers 4 Learning and the Aspiring Principals Leadership Programs are designed to focus and maximise our leadership impact across the school by meeting some of the goals in our school improvement plan. During our Term 2 staff development day on 19 April, the teaching staff will be using the National Literacy Progressions to evaluate student writing and develop learning intentions and success criteria (LISC) to help students improve with appropriate, descriptive feedback.


COVID restrictions

The response to COVID restrictions varies between schools because each school's response to the Department of Education's guidelines is based on each school's unique context. As a community, we also need to understand that the guidelines can change very quickly.

Currently, parents/carers are welcome to enter the school grounds before and after school to drop off and pick up their children. This is based on the understanding that parents/carers comply with social distancing from each other, teachers and other students. They also need to leave when the morning assembly song begins. If parents/carers are using the uniform shop or entering classrooms for parent/teacher interviews or meetings, they still need to sign in at the office and use the COVID app.

As a school we are looking at different ways to hold events for our school community, while complying with the DoE's guidelines. We want to include parents as much as possible, however, social distancing means we do not always have space available to invite parents and visitors into the school for whole school events. AED Census

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) measures how children have developed by the time they start school. The AEDC looks at groups of children, not individuals. This survey is conducted in Term 2 with students in Kindergarten.

With four sets of data collected every three years since 2009, valuable trend data is used to help governments and communities design programs and policies that better meet the needs of children and families. Teachers of children in kindergarten use the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument (AEDI), which measures children across five areas of development. These areas are closely linked to children's overall health, education and social outcomes as they mature into adults:

- physical health and wellbeing
- social competence
- emotional maturity
- language and cognitive skills (school based)
- communication skills and general knowledge.



NAPLAN

During Week 4 and 5 of Term 2 ($10^{th} - 21^{st}$ May 2021), students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be completing their NAPLAN assessments. With the exception of the Year 3 writing test, students will be completing these assessments online. The *NAPLAN Online 2021* guide for parents has been attached for your information.

Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a practice assessment for the online components of NAPLAN during Weeks 9-10 this term. They are also receiving additional opportunities in class to familiarise themselves with the testing format.

An assessment schedule, outlining the dates students will be completing each of the NAPLAN assessments, will be distributed early in Term 2. If you anticipate that your child will be away during the NAPLAN assessment period, please contact the school office as soon as possible. If you have any questions regarding NAPLAN please contact your child's teacher, Ms McMillan or Mr Duffy.






Harmony Day Art Competition
