Learning From Home.

I am looking forward to being able to say, "Welcome Back." Instead, I am thanking you for your amazing support of our school at such a difficult time. I also want to acknowledge all of the support and encouragement you have given to the staff, each other and myself during this time. It is greatly appreciated.

As you know, we are all being encouraged to keep our children at home so they are safe, by limiting our movement throughout our community. I share your pain during this time, as do most of our staff, who are trying their best to serve our school from home, while also supervising their own children's learning at home. I know how difficult it is to be working from home while my own children (Year 2 and Year 5) are learning from home... And I understand how difficult it is when your child would prefer to be doing anything else instead of completing the work set by the teacher!

The best advice I can give is to have realistic expectations for ourselves and our children. Having our children and our families safe is our greatest concern. This situation is not ideal and none of us are perfect, so just do your reasonable best. Our teachers understand this.

This is a wonderful opportunity to acknowledge how proud I am of all of our school staff. They have gone well above and beyond in preparing quality learning programs, resources and all of the systems in the background to support online learning. Even though we anticipated this last term, I know that most of the staff freely gave up most of their "holiday" time preparing for home learning.

The Department of Education states that parents must keep children - of all ages, across primary and secondary schooling and early childcare - home if they can. Students will be supported to learn from home. Schools and early childhood education and care services, including Out Of School Hours Care services are open for any child that needs it.

As of Sunday evening, this means that all staff in schools are being rostered to work from home to reduce their movement and interaction in the community. Minimal supervision is provided for students who need to be at school. The office is staffed remotely. 


Learning at home packs

We are doing our best to keep you informed and this is challenging because the NSW Health advice changes throughout the week in response to the changing situation. This impacts our community because we have to implement Department of Education procedures.

NSW Health asks that we all stay home and avoid all risk of transmission, hence one of the changes introduced across the region this week was that the packs cannot be collected from schools. The packs were only ever intended for the few families who do not have <u>any</u> access to online learning. Here are a few options that you may like to consider:

• You may like to request work to be emailed by the class teacher and print it, or have your children view it on a mobile phone, smart TV or an Xbox or Playstation.







- Not every child needs to be in front of their own individual screen all day long. Apart from online sessions
 with the teacher, the timetable is a recommendation. Your children could access work via
 phone/laptop/iPad at different times of the day and rotate time for play, eating and fitness activities while
 their siblings (or you) need the device.
- Instead of printing, use a small whiteboard or scrap paper for your children to record their answers/responses and then this can be photographed and emailed back to the teacher.
- If you believe printing is necessary and you do not have a printer, Officeworks has an online print and collect service: https://www.officeworks.com.au/print-copy/info/pcc-print-and-copy-self-serve
- If you are thinking about buying a device, some computer companies give discounts for school children, especially when the orders are placed online. They also deliver to your home.

We do not want any student to miss out on learning, so if none of these options work for you, please contact your child's teacher and we will help you with a solution.


