Term 3 has flown by and we would like to thank the whole school community for your support. We are grateful to see that at every event we hold, parents always want to be involved in the school community. The P&C have held several community events, all of which were very successful.

We ask that the community please keep an eye on the school during the school holidays and call 1300 880 021 if you notice anything suspicious.

Students return on Monday 10 October as there is no Staff Development Day. Staff have also completed their end of Term 4 Staff Development Day after school which means their last day will be the same as the students on Monday 19 December.

In Term 4 we are looking forward to welcoming our new Kindergarten students at the transition days. If you have a child starting next year, it is very important to complete the online enrolment form so we are ready to welcome your child and you to our transition days.

Work Around the School – Please Use Caution

During the holiday time we are hoping to have a covered walkway linking Block F (Library, K-2 and special education classrooms) with the toilet blocks.

We have also arranged for the canteen area gates to be replaced with bi-folding doors. This will make the canteen area more user friendly and improve the comfort for everyone working in Block A (the 2-3 storey building).

Our playground upgrade is progressing well and hopefully the wet weather will not hamper this over the school holidays. The synthetic multipurpose court is beginning to take shape.

In the meantime, we are still using the double gates in Wandella Road to exit and enter the school. This involves walking over uneven ground that can be slippery when wet.

If you are affected by balance issues or a physical impairment, please use the gates in Sylva Avenue instead. We are all responsible for our personal safety.

Staffing Update

A number of students and staff have been away from school over the past few weeks (mainly due to COVID, the flu and other viruses circulating throughout the community). This means that when casuals are not available, some classes are split, or other support programs have been collapsed.



This week the staff held a small morning tea to acknowledge the selfless dedication given to so many students in our school by Mrs Connie Metros, who announced her retirement at the end of last year. Mrs Metros leaves a wonderful legacy for so many students and teachers whom she has helped.

Preparing for 2023 Classes

If you have information that you would like the school to consider for 2023, please organise an interview with your child's class teacher, assistant principal, or Mrs Wilkins <u>now.</u>

Placing students in classes is a complex process and a lot of factors are taken into consideration to ensure the

best placement for each student with the resources available to the school.

No promises can be made, because we need to consider all the students and meet with Department of Education funding protocols.

We are in a better position to consider your information if it is conveyed well in advance.

Repetition

Research has shown that repetition is only effective in a small number of cases, so this is not a decision that can be rushed through at the last minute. Parents may be required to:

- speak with the school counsellor to organise an assessment.
- answer surveys along with class teachers, and
- meet with the learning support team so that a fully informed decision can be made.

If you were thinking about repetition for your child, you should have already made an appointment with Mrs Wilkins or your child's assistant principal.
























Principal's Awards

We don't have the answers to those questions. In an ethics class the children form their own views through respectful discussion with their classmates, guided by our trained volunteers.

Ethics classes support children to develop the life skills they need to consider other points of view and make decisions based on evidence and reasoning rather than habit or peer pressure.

Lessons are facilitated by impartial ethics teachers who are trained to deliver our Education Dept approved curriculum. Full, free training and lessons are provided for you.

Classes run for 40 mins at the same time as scripture each week.

The demand for Ethics Classes is so high we do not have enough Volunteers to facilitate classes, and sadly not all our students are able to participate.




Support children to listen empathetically, disagree respectfully, build on each other's ideas and use evidence and reasoning to make decisions rather than act out of habit or peer pressure.
