### **2023 Kindergarten Enrolments**

All enrolments for Kindergarten in 2023 need to be completed now, so we have time to include your child in our orientation program. If you have (or know of a friend who has) a preschool child turning 6 next year, please urge them to come to the school and complete their enrolment now. Before children can start school, parents will need to bring original copies of:

- the student's Australian birth certificate (or family passports and VISAs);
- the student's immunisation certificate (from Medicare); and
- proof that they are living in the area, e.g.: rates notice or lease agreement and a utility bill (such as council rates, water, gas or electricity).

Set your children up for success: If your children have any special needs, we need to know now so we can begin organising support. Please bring in any reports from professionals who have been supporting your child.

### **Work Around the School – Please Use Caution**

Our playground upgrade is starting to take shape since the dry weather began. The drainage system has been completed and work is underway to install the synthetic multipurpose court.

In the meantime, we are using the double gates in Wandella Road to exit and enter the school and this involves walking over uneven ground, that could be slippery when wet.

If you are affected by balance issues or a physical impairment, please use the gates in Sylva Avenue instead. We are all responsible for our personal safety.

### **Preparing for 2023 Classes**

If you have information that you would like the school to consider for 2023, please organise an interview with your child's class teacher, assistant principal, or Mrs Wilkins **now**.

Placing students in classes is a complex process and a lot of factors are taken into consideration to ensure the best placement for each student with the resources available to the school.

No promises can be made, because we need to consider all the students and meet with Department of Education funding protocols.

We are in a better position to consider your information if it is conveyed well in advance.

### Repetition

Research has shown that repetition is only effective in a small number of cases, so this is not a decision that can be rushed through at the last minute. Parents may be required to:

- speak with the school counsellor to organise an assessment.
- answer surveys along with class teachers, and
- meet with the learning support team so that a fully informed decision can be made.

If you have been thinking about repetition for your child, please approach Mrs Wilkins or your child's assistant principal **now**.


Students can receive principals' awards after they have earned ten merit awards. The school awards system is currently being reviewed.

### **Check-in assessment**

Students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will soon be participating in the Check- in Assessment. The Check-in assessment is an NSW Department of Education online literacy and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessment can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Students with a disability may receive the same level of support during the assessment they would normally receive in the classroom. The assessments will be scheduled:

- Year 6: Week 9 Monday and Tuesday
- Years 3, 4 and 5: Early Term 4 (More information to come)

All students complete a reading assessment and a numeracy assessment. Year 6 students will also complete a writing task.

Students will be asked to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment. If your child doesn't have headphones the school has a limited supply that can be shared.

# FUN IN DRONES 5 ONYX

### TERM 3 WEEK 8

This term the year 5 students from 4/5 Onyx have been engaged in science with drones. Each Tuesday as part of our Exploring Forces unit, year 5 has been learning about how to code and fly drones on land and in the air. This has involved a lot of teamwork as the students have been in pairs, taking turns to add a variety of codes to a sequence, testing the sequence, and then discussing how to change the sequence to get it just right. This can be very particular as each drone moves and flies differently, so the smallest of changes to the code might set the drone short of the target or smash into the wall! The students have faced a number of challenges that have required them to move around cones and land in particular places collecting points and proving they are ready to move on to more challenging tasks. Some weeks it becomes a fun friendly competition between each stage 3 class to see who can get more points, this week we took the win by a landside getting over 40 points more than the other two classes! Way to go 5 Onyx! We have two weeks left of the program now and will be sad when it finishes. It has been such a fun addition to our learning journey that has engaged the students in learning skills they might need in a future career.



# EXPLORING COUNTRIES 4 ONYX

Over the last few weeks, the year 4 students from 4/5 Onyx have been working on an independent research project where they were tasked to research one of Australia's neighboring countles as part of their Geography unit. Most of the students chose New Zealand as it was the country of most interest to them, however, they also researched The Pacific Islands and Papa New Guinea. To begin the project, the students used a research booklet to gather notes on their chosen country and organise them into categories to help plan their presentations. Once the research was complete the students put together a persuasive brochure and an informative poster. These were then presented to the school as an exhibition where the students were asked questions and shared their work with their peers. The students were nervous at first to share their projects, however, it was clear that once their peers started to visit, their confidence grew as they showed pride in their work. Well done year 4!









### K-2 & SU Excursion

Our K-2 and SEU students went to Bicentennial Park for an excursion to learn all about animal habitats, our bushland and how Aboriginal People lived on country. We learnt so much and had a wonderful day! Everyone's behaviour was exceptional and the educators at Homebush were very impressed with the interesting questions our students asked. We were very lucky to see a blue tongue lizard, explore the mangroves and scavenger hunt in the bushland. It was lots of fun!





Thank you so much for continuously supporting our school, especially through fundraising. This term, we are hosting a **Colour Explosion School Fun Run** to raise money for new bubblers and the Year 6 Farewell. We have currently raised over \$2500 with 4/50 leading the race for the class who has fundraised the most followed closely by 1/2D and 1/2P.

They will participate in a range of activities during this session including the Colour Run obstacle challenge, a disco run by Groove Nation and have the opportunity to purchase snacks from the P & C stall. At the conclusion of our session students will receive an ice block to help them cool off after all their physical activity.
